How to Utilize the Scorecards

In these scorecards, you will find analysis and information about rural and agricultural issues that were debated and presented in the 2025 Legislature. You will find information about the issue/bill, a breakdown of what happened to it in the 2025 Legislature, and MFU's position. On the following pages there is a breakdown of how your legislator voted.

KEY TO READING THE TABLES:

Bills have votes in committees and on the House and Senate Floors.

Green means the legislator's vote agreed with MFU's position. Red means the legislator's vote did not agree with MFU's position. The darker the color, the more times they voted for or against our position.

Sometimes a bill can change during its journey through the legislature, and that may be why the legislator changed their vote. Ask them!

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

Reach out to your legislator, or any of the legislators at the end of this book. Tell the legislator your name, where you live, and why agriculture is important to you.

If their votes are green, say THANK YOU! Tell them why you support their vote.

If their votes are red, tell them why this issue is important to you. Ask them to keep the needs of farmers, ranchers, and rural communities in mind for future votes.

SJ 25: Joint resolution urging Congress to support MCOOL

Montana Farmers Union **supported** SJ 25



SJ 25 urges support for MCOOL for beef and pork, calling out the recently re-introduced American Beef Labeling Act in Congress. Ranchers deserve credit for the high-quality products they raise, and consumers deserve accurate and honest labels so they can make the decisions that are best for their family and their food dollars. Pork and beef are the only products that are not subject to mandatory Country of Origin Labeling. In 2015, Congress repealed MCOOL only for beef and pork following lobbying from the multinational meat packing monopoly. These multinational packing companies stand to profit more without mandatory COOL because they can import foreign cheaper, lower-quality products and still use the USDA inspected label, which is confusing to consumers who think it's a label of origin. SJ 25 sent a message to Montana's Congressional Delegation, Governor Gianforte, Secretary Rollins of USDA, and the United States Trade Representative that the Montana Legislature, Montana ranchers, and consumers want this issue fixed. The resolution is helping push the issue at the federal level, where meaningful action is possible thanks to the reintroduction of Sen. John Thune's American Beef Labeling Act and Rep. Harriet Hageman's Country of Origin Labeling Enforcement Act of 2025. Rep. Rep. Zinke has already signed onto House bill. Tell Rep. SB 246: Provide for Montana First Procurement laws and establish reporting requirements

Montana Farmers Union **supported** SB 246



SB 246 provides a reporting requirement for contracts for the procurement of food products by a governmental body with a total contract value of \$100,000 or more. This serves as a great starting place to gain an understanding of where the state is at with using Montana taxpayer dollars for procurement of our large state institutional contracts (state hospitals, Department of Corrections, University systems, etc.).

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Bill was referred to the Senate State Administration committee and passed 9-0 (a yes vote supported MFU's position)

Bill passed third reading in the Senate 44-6 (a yes vote supported MFU's position)

Bill was referred to the House State Administration committee and passed 14-5 (a yes vote supported MFU's position)

Bill passed third reading in the House and the amended third reading in the Senate 41-7 (a yes vote supported MFU's position) Bill was signed by the Governor

SJ 11: Interim study on farmer's markets and food systems

SJ 11 is a study to look at clarifying the regulatory framework around farmer's markets in Montana and provides the opportunity for stakeholders to come to the table and figure out what may or may not be working. There have been a lot of changes around cottage food laws and homemade local foods in the last couple of legislative sessions, which has created confusion for both those selling at markets and those working on the food safety and liability.

Bill passed third reading in the Senate 34-16 (a yes vote supported MFU's position)

Bill was referred to the House Agriculture committee and passed 17-0 (a yes vote supported MFU's position)

HB 440: Providing tax incentives to put Montana-produced food first

Montana Farmers Union **supported** HB 440



One of the biggest problems producers face is access to markets. HB 440 proposed to provide a tax incentive opportunity for retailers to stock Montana foods on their shelves, providing a subtraction from individual income and corporate income taxes for the income from Montana-Produced food. The Montana Food First bill supported local farmers, ranchers, growers, retailers, grocers, and entrepreneurs, and would have kept more consumer food dollars in our local economies. The goal of this bill was to provide an incentive opportunity for retailers to stock Montana foods on their shelves, providing a subtraction from individual income and corporate income taxes for the income from Montana-Produced food. This would have been completely voluntary and would let them decide what is best for them and their community.

Bill was passed by the House Taxation committee 18-3 (a yes vote supported MFU's position)

Bill passed second reading in the House 59-41 (a yes vote supported MFU's position)

Bill was referred to the House Appropriations committee and tabled 13-10 (a yes vote was against MFU's position and killed the bill)

SB 509: Revise ownership laws related to farm equipment embedded software- electronic control unit, sensor, switches, and controls

Montana Farmers Union **supported** SB 509



SB 509 proposed to provide farmers, ranchers, and independent mechanics the tools and diagnostic software necessary to repair their own equipment by designating that all embedded software in agricultural equipment is considered sold to the owner, rather than just licensed. Montana farmers and ranchers should be able to repair their equipment themselves or choose a local mechanic, rather than being forced to only use an authorized equipment dealer. Currently, there are only three major agriculture equipment manufacturers that sell most of the equipment in Montana. Most new equipment utilizes electronic control units to operate nearly all its functions. Without access to the diagnostic software and hardware to troubleshoot problems, this prevents local mechanics and equipment owners from diagnosing and repairing agriculture equipment.



HB 119: Establish the Montana Cattle Committee

Montana Farmers Union **opposed** HB 119



HB 119 proposed to create a politically appointed committee that would collect an assessment fee of \$1 from Montana Cattle producers upon a referendum vote. MFU opposed this bill because a new committee to manage this fee would be duplicative. Of the 19 states with a second check-off, Montana would be the only state to unnecessarily create a second bureaucracy. We also had issues with the proposed committee makeup. We recommend that the committee makeup be expanded to include Intertribal Agriculture Council, Montana Meat Processors, and Montana Feeders Association. The Governor should appoint one representative from each nominating organization and one at-large member. Regarding the proposed referendum, the bill only had a majority vote requirement. There should be a vote threshold – a 40% voter turnout threshold to be a valid referendum. This is how Montana law currently governs bond and levy votes. There should also be a time limit on the first referendum voting period – if the threshold is not met in 30 days it fails. The referendum should be redone every 5 years to ensure it is still what producers want. While Montana Farmers Union does not have an issue with a second beef check-off, we want to see it done efficiently and in a way that benefits most producers.

SB 189: Lower residential, commercial, and agricultural property tax rates

Montana Farmers Union **supported** SB 189



MFU supported SB 189. The bill would have lowered property tax rates for main street businesses, farmers, ranchers, and residential property owners. MFU policy supports rebalancing the tax burden between corporate, small business, residential, and agricultural taxpayers.

During the 2023 legislative session, the legislature chose not to equalize taxable values in response to rapid increases in residential property prices. This bill would take a good step to bring back fairness for farmers, who often pay multiple types of taxes. With this bill, the Department of Revenue projects that, in Yellowstone County, people owning grazing land would have paid \$15 less per acre on a 120-acre parcel, and a commercial property owner in McCone County would have paid \$408 less on a \$100,000 property.


